NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Brother Sojourners,

I give a hearty "thank you" for the confidence you have entrusted to me, the National Line and all of our National Officers. We are indeed fortunate to have such a talented cadre at the helm of our Order as we face the numerous challenges ahead of us. Building on the successes of the past few years, we have made progress in a number of areas, yet there is still much to do.

We have just completed our 93rd Annual National Convention in San Antonio as I write this message. Thanks to chapter manager, Brother LTC Elliott Samuels, PNP, LOH, and his team, it was a memorable convention. We were blessed with the largest number of first-time attendees in recent memory, and I hope they enjoyed themselves to such an extent that they will bring more first-timers to Austin in 2014.

In committee meetings and the general session, many areas critical to our future success and vitality were reviewed, discussed, debated and choices were made that will guide us for the next few years.

Financially, we are making some progress, but many program, personnel and support areas are in need of increased funding. I believe that the Order well epitomizes an old adage – "We have done so much for

so long with so little, that we can do anything forever with nothing" – that should not be the way we continue to operate. While our two major funds, the Sojourner Endowment Memorial Fund and the National Sojourner Trust Fund, increased by approximately 2% and 5% respectively, additional growth is a necessity as costs rise. Our tax-exempt, non-profit Spirit of America Education Foundation is before the Internal Revenue Service for final review and approval.

I will soon be issuing a National Circular adding the Lodge of Military Tribute, the Ladies at the Table Lodge and the Colonial Ladies at the Table Lodge to the stable of programs we offer to our Blue Lodges with the caveat that the programs be acceptable to the Grand Lodges before presentation. I strongly support both versions of our Youth Leadership Conferences, and will be in Valley Forge in July to continue our partnership with Freedoms Foundation. Other programs are being considered as well. Please use all of our people and programs to present the concepts of Americanism and Patriotism within your Lodges, appendant Bodies and communities.

Membership is a vital and sometimes contentious issue, as it was in San Antonio. Overall, our membership has declined

to slightly less than eight thousand due to mortality among our older members and resignations for reasons of health, occupation and perceived discrimination against those who did not reach a certain minimum rank while in the service. While both resolutions having to do with membership criteria were defeated the resolution opening regular membership to those in grade E-5 and above lost by less than 4% giving rise to disappointment among some of our brethren. There are good and cogent reasons on both sides of the argument, and disappointment could have gone the other way.

I ask everyone to remember that National Sojourners is a Masonic organization subject to the By-Laws governing the Order, and that there is a process to effect change. While that process is working, I ask you to circumscribe your passions and work together for the good of our great Nation, Freemasonry in general and our beloved National Sojourners.

As we travel around during the next year, Becky and I hope to meet and meet with many Sojourners and Ladies. Until next time, we wish you an exciting and satisfying summer.

CONDENSED PROCEEDINGS 93RD ANNUAL CONVENTION

Brother James R. McConnell, National President called to order the 93rd Annual

Convention at 1330 Hours on 20 June 2013. Brother Elliott Samuels proceed to present the Hotel Representative who he had worked with as Convention Manager. He then introduced representatives of Ft Sam Houston #17 and Corpus Christi #397 who were volunteering in working to ensure a successful convention. He then presented a citation from the County welcoming National Sojourners to San Antonio.

The Colors were presented by Somerset High School Junior ROTC unit.

Brother Keye Perry Sr. then led those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance to the U. S. Flag. Brother Floyd Gilbert, PNP, attended the Bible and gave opening prayer. Bro. McConnell then gave the Toast to the Flag on behalf of Brother Merlen Howe was not able to attend. Brother James Higdon, National 2nd Vice President gave the Purposes of National Sojourners and Bro. James Baker, National 3rd Vice President gave the Pronouncement.

He then called upon Brother William G. Sizemore, Chairman of the Fraternal Liaison Committee to introduce the Fraternal Dignitaries. Bro. Sizemore then recognized all Past Masters, Worshipful Masters, Past and I Curennt Heads of appendant bodies, Past Grand Masters (3), and Grand Lodge officers. Bro. McConnell then recognized all Camp Commanders, Past National Commanders, Van Deventer recipients, Chapter Presidents, Past National Presidents, Legion of Honor recipients. He then recognized all of the Ladies present and first timers with their ladies.

He then called for a Roll Cal of all National Officers present. The roll was called and 67 answered.

Brother Kent S. Webber, President of Collingwood was called for his report He presented his report and the announced that the recipient of the Director of the Year was Brother James R. McConnell.

He then called on Brother Schwebel for the report on NASOCOCO. He announced that Greenville South Carolina had been selected for the 2016 Annual Convention.

He then called on Brother Sizemore for the report of the Nominating Committee. The report is as follows: National President-Elect - Merlen Howe, 1st Vice President, James Higdon, 2nd Vice President –James Baker, 3rd Vice President - Ron Sortino. National Trustees for a three year term: James R. McConnell, Sid Shaenfield, Fred Vihovde and a 1 year term – Pedro Arroyo. There were no nominees for the Honors award Committee or the Sojourner Ritual Committee. Committee of 33 (3 year term) Clyde W. Barnes, Armand Cote, Gerald Houston, Henry Kuhn, Paul McCullough, Charles Sharp, and Joseph Zito. Emeritus Status, James S. Norris, and Justin "Rip" Van Kleeck. Bro. McConnell the dismissed the Nominating Committee and appointed them as Tellers for the election.

He then called on Brother David Gardner, National Commander, Heroes of '76 for his remarks. He moved that his report be accepted as printed. Seconded and approved.

Brother McConnell than proceeded to recognize a Sojourner of 61 years, Brother William Koeckert, Past National President in 1978 – 1979. He was not present at the time and was given a Certificate of Recognition when he returned to the room.

Brother Keye Perry Sr. was called upon to present the recipient of the Memphis Award. He read the citation and the award was presented to Brother Carl Diamond as the Central Area Representative.

Brother McConnell the read the citation for the Houghton Award (2nd highest award for National Sojourners) He asked all previous recipients to assemble in front of the room and welcome Brother Ron Sortino as the newest recipient. Bro. Harry Sanders escorted Bro. Sortino to the podium where he was presented his award.

He then recessed the convention at 1506 Hours until Friday.

The convention was reconvened at 0830 Hours on 21 June 2013. Brother Gilbert attended the Bible and gave the invocation. Brother McConnell led those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance.

He then called upon Brother Roy Ota to present the report of the Honors Award Committee. Honors Award Committee: Brother Richard Williamson was nominated and elected for a 5 year term,

Sojourner Ritual Committee: Brother Charles Folsom and Ronald Stites were nominated and elected for a 3 year term

Committee of 33: The following were nominated from the floor: Mark Miles, Denny Norris, Randy Geck, Gary Bunnell and Louis Numkin. The delegates were instructed to vote for all nominees and the length of their term would by the number of votes received. A written ballot was held and the following were elected: (3 Year Term) Joseph Zito, Paul McCullough, Henry Kuhn, Cylde Barnes, Denny Norris, Gerald Houston, Armand Cote, Randy Geck, Charles Sharp and Gary Bunnell; (2 Year term) Louis Numkin; and (1 year term) Alonzo Smith.

Emeritus: Brothers James S. Norris and Justin "Rip" Van Kleeck were elected by voice vote.

The reports of the National Officers and Committee Chairman were made.

Historian – Woodruff Bentley presented his oral report. The following reports were moved to be accepted as printed: Secretary/Treasurer , Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Ritual Committee, President – Elect, Education & Training, Bridge of Light, Information Technology, Fraternal Liaison, Membership, Gifts & Bequests, Americanism, Incentives & Awards, Publications Review Board, Chapter Chartering and Revitalization, NASOCOCO, Area and Region Reps, and Committee of 33. The Vice Presidents presented their reports prior to the Committees they monitored.





Initially drafted into the United States Army as an enlisted soldier, he went through boot camp before being notified he passed the New York State bar examination, whereupon he became an officer in the Judge Advocate Generals Corps.

His military career began at Fort Benning Georgia in 1957, and for next 31 years he was promoted and stationed at several bases including Fort Amador in the Panama Canal Zone; Judge Advocate General's School in Charlottesville Virginia; Chief Legal Officer XXIV Corp. in Vietnam; Deputy Judge Advocate Commander-in-Chief Pacific Area Command; Legal Advisor to NATO Forces Southern Region (Italy, Greece and Turkey); Circuit Judge, Fort Dix, New Jersey; Chief Legal Officer at Fort Meade, Maryland; U.S. Army Intelligence Command, Fort Holabird, Maryland; Circuit Judge in Germany; and Appellate Criminal Court Judge with the U.S. Army Court of Military Review (the highest criminal court in the U.S. Army).

PNP Marden is a fifty year member of masonry, having been raised to the degree of master mason at Fort Benning A.F. & A.M. Lodge 579, in Georgia. Judge Marden joined Shiloh Lodge F. & A.M. 558 of Souderton, Pennsylvania. He was awarded the Legion of Honor in 2010. His Masonic offices included National Sojourner's, Past National President 1985 – 1986; National Sojourner's, Past President Panama Chapter #35 & Charleston, W.Va. #440; National Sojourner's, Comm. of 33, Past Member and Chairman; National Sojourner's, National Judge Advocate 1973-1979; National Sojourner's, National Trustees & Past Chairman; Heroes of '76, Past National Commander 1995-1996; Retired Officers Association, Mountaineer Chapter, Past President 1988 – 1990; National Sojourner's Benjamin Franklin Chapter 16, trustee; and National Sojourner's Valley Forge Chapter 444, trustee and vice president.

In early July 2013, Judge Marden was honored by proclamation by the Borough of Souderton, and by citation by the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for his many years of public service to his country and community.
